

UTokyo Global FFDP



- » Variation of the program in Japanese language, adjusted to potential international learning backgrounds and potential international academic futures.
- » Mainly focused on developing the educational awareness of the participants (educational development).
- » Training and development of **future faculty** members using the **English** language and a **global** and **state-of-the-art** perspective to address its contents and practices.
- » Common Graduate Course. Possibility of **earning 2 credits** following the procedures of each affiliated school. **Certificate of completion** issued upon successful completion.

(Note that completion of the program does not lead to getting a position at the institution.)



UTokyo Global FFDP. Potential participants



- » Those with **English language skills** (oral, written and interactive) to **actively** participate in the program and who are:
 - Graduate students, post-doctoral researchers and researchers at The University of Tokyo.
 - Faculty members at The University of Tokyo (in special, for those with fewer years of teaching experience).

(If the number of applicants exceeds the prescribed number, selection will be made by examining the written items in the **application forms**, balancing the variety of disciplines among participants and their **experience**, and considering their **language skills**. JSPS fellows will be prioritized for selection).

» Observers from within The University of Tokyo and from other institutions are (very) welcomed.

- 8 sessions (one session every two weeks, in general).
- Applications will open early in 2022.

- \rightarrow How do students learn?
 - → How can we contribute to our students' learning?
 - → How can we obtain information on how/what our students learn and the results/impact of our courses/lessons? How can we use that information to contribute to our students' learning, to grading, and to improve our courses/lessons?
 - \rightarrow How can we design our course aligning teaching objectives and learning outcomes with strategies, assessment and resources?
 - → How can we design our lessons aligning teaching objectives and learning outcomes with strategies, assessment and resources?
 - → How can we deliver and improve our lessons to contribute to our students' learning?
 - → Are there any gaps in what we learned? Take ownership of the knowledge and your future learning: problematize, "forget", rethink, imagine, & plan.

UTokyo Global FFDP. Main goals of the program



- » This program seeks to contribute to the training of future faculty members. To do so, it aims to:
- Promote professional and educational reflection, discussion, and critical pedagogical thinking.
- Contribute to the development of key educational and transversal competences to support student-centered teaching and learning processes.
- Foster an inclusive, responsible, and ethical approach to teaching and learning and to educational research and innovation.
- Provide learning by doing opportunities for a congruent educational development.
- Generate community-building attitudes and opportunities.
- Nurture scholarly, evidence-based, and technology-enhanced educational practices.
- Develop a cross-cultural and international approach to the role of higher education institutions, to the academic profession, and to teaching and learning.
- Cultivate continuous professional/career development and lifelong learning attitudes.



UTokyo Global FFDP. Learning outcomes




- » Upon successful completion, participants should be able (at a fundamental level) to:
- Provide and **reason** substantial insights on the significance, implications, and professional requirements of fulfilling the **role of educator** when becoming a faculty member.
- **Distinguish** the diversity of roles, functions, and approaches among HE institutions to education and to the teaching and learning process.
- Actively engage in professional and educational self-reflection for the improvement of their teaching and learning processes.
- Demonstrate and argue a scholarly, critical, and analytical pedagogical stance to their educational practice.
- Assess and deconstruct their teaching ideas, practices and the teaching and learning processes they design.
- Determine their professional learning needs and articulate a continuous development plan to satisfy them.
- Significatively participate in peer-reflection and discussion about teaching and learning with faculty members from different backgrounds.
- Design syllabuses and design and conduct lessons from an active student-centered approach.
- Design, conduct, and align educational assessment with the learning goals and teaching and learning strategies that they propose.
- Design syllabuses and design and conduct lessons integrating adequately and with meaning educational resources and learning environments.
- **Design** syllabuses and design and **conduct** lessons from an ethical, **inclusive**, diversity-respectful, and responsible perspective.
- **Design** syllabuses and design and **conduct** lessons from an **evidence-based, cross-cultural,** and transdisciplinary perspective.



UTokyo Global FFDP. Key terms



- The program. Experiential learning and learning by doing (practicing, designing, conducting), continuous bi-directional feedback, reflection & discussion, ...
- Contents.
 - Educational:
 - o T-L strategies, assessment, syllabus/lesson design, learning resources & environments, ...
 - o Student-centered, active learning, significant learning, ...
 - Professional: academic profession, HE institutions, career development, lifelong learning, ...
- Pedagogical and professional attitudes.
 - Scholarly, evidence-based, innovative, integrative, ...
 - Inclusive, ethical, responsible, ...
 - Cross-cultural, international, transdisciplinary, collegial, team-work ...
 - Adaptative expertise, (peer- & self-) assessment & reflection, discussion, critical pedagogical thinking, arguing, deconstructing, problematizing, ...





UTokyo Global FFDP. Parallel structure & additional opportunities



1h luncheon sessions for community building, discussion and feedback about the program (voluntary)

Every other week, participants will have the chance of meeting together with the facilitator to, in an <u>informal environment</u>, keeping track of their ideas, doubts, comments, and concerns, about the contents, the development of the program, their own professional development, etc.

Consultation for educational development (voluntary)

For those participants with an option to teach in a real-class environment, the program will offer them the chance of consulting doubts and participating in a process of <u>class-observation and responsible feedback</u> with other participants, senior lecturers, and/or alumni.

Social program for community building and professional development (voluntary)

For those interested, the program will organize <u>extra-curricular and educational activities</u> for community building and professional development. This includes, among others, the visit to another higher education institution in Japan to explore contexts different to the one at The University of Tokyo.

Career & life plan advising with alumni & community building and professional development (voluntary)

For those interested, the program will organize open and informal discussions with alumni (and/or other professionals) to talk about career advancements, prospects, life planning, etc.
