
- Response to the Mini-report
- (1) Dealing with the memories of people in neighboring nations requires the creation of a mental peace of mind. Step back and take a distance from the past.
- (2) Make up your mind that this issue will take time and that there is no short term solution.
- (3) Observe well the present day conditions that surround such issues faced by these nations.
- Calm down. If the makeup of the issues is comprehended, corresponding measures can be taken.

- 1. Problems of "National History"
- •Offender Victim relationship may not exist but even then... Issues of Kokuryo and Balhae occur between Korea • China
- ←This is a projection of present day "nation-state" framework on the past.
 - 1) anachronism(mix-up of era)
 - Study of History: The structure of past society is different from that of the present. That is why there is value in doing research.
 - "Historical stories" novels TV programs: All choose past as the stage screen projection of present society replay
 - 2) Instability of International Relations Do away with Advantages of One's Nation

- Identity as a National and as a Citizen
 - Ensure Commonality

Mainly about how they rise to success=Development of a Nation

Literature of Shiki assumes an integral part in this

approx. 5/6 is Russo-Japanese War

"Truly lengthy is this story about some optimists that can be described as unheard of in Japanese history. Eventually they come to put at stake their lives, without much thought in a preposterous Russo-Japanese War....Optimists....they move forward by looking forward at what is before them. In moving up, if there is a single white cloud glaring in the middle of the blue sky above the slope, they will undoubtedly go on climbing with their eyes solely glued to the cloud." (1) Is it Colonialism, Is it Imperialism.

"The cause of Russo-Japanese War was in Manchuria and Korea. Russia after having occupied Manchuria will in due course take Korea. This was extremely evident. If Japan lost in the Russo-Japanese War, there is no question that Korea would have been under the ownership of Russia." (Pocket Editionbook3-68)

"From the 19th century to this day, territories and nations of the world are either colony of other nations or not. Disliking being a colony, they must obtain military power by developing their industry and join the company of Imperialistic Nations. There are only these two roads permissible." (Paperbook3-173)

Chronology

- 1900 Boxer Rebellion Troop Dispatch by Great Powers Russia does not withdraw from Manchuria
- 1901 Failure of negotiations to exchange Manchuria with Korea (Man Kan Koukan)
- 1902 The Anglo-Japanese Alliance signed.
- 1903 Bezobrazofu established the Yalu River Lumber Company Anti-Russia League, Resolution requesting withdrawal from Manchuria
- 1904 Feb. War starts
- 1905 1 Surrender of Lushun 3 Battle of Mukden 5 Naval Battle of Tsushima 9 Conclusion of Portsmouth Peace Treaty 10 Hibiya Incendiary Incident

- What if Japan was defeated?
 - → Most probably, Russia would have occupied all territory of Manchuria and the Korean Peninsula.

But, what if there was no Russo-Japanese War?

→ Exchange of Manchuria and Korea


Russia would have occupied all the territory of Manchuria.

Japan would have occupied Korea.

Russian Emperor Nicolas II did wish this.

Post war was dealt with by Russo-Japan entente and similar solutions

- Is a Fixed Bisection Method Feasible?
- 1880s Japanese government adopted the policy of neutrality in Korean Peninsula
 - Ever since the Gapsin Coup(1884) Yuan Shikai was stationed in Seoul
- 1890 Prime Minister Aritomo Yamagata "Theory of Foreign Policy"
 - Neutralization of the Korean Peninsula by deeming Russia as key enemy, collaboration with China, inviting the involvement of England and Germany
 - Four years later the Sino-Japanese War began.
- Importance of Policy Selection and Dependence on a Single Path
 - Joseph Nye "Understanding International Conflicts" Yuhikaku

In his novels, such views are expressed at every occasion. Wonder if it is possible in his movies?



 - Fund raising Espionage activities Peace negotiations




