As for the exercise below, the manual of World Medical Association points out a few points in dispute. What are these?

3 Doctor R is a family physician in a small provincial town. There came an approach from a contract research organization (CRO) for the doctor to participate in clinical testing for new nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAID) against osteoarthropathy. She was to receive money in proportion to the number of patients she would register for clinical researches. The CRO guaranteed that it had obtained all approval for this testing, as well as the one by the ethics committee. Having no experience of participating in a drug trial, Dr. R felt good about it particularly for a special compensation to be provided for. Thus she accepted to take part in it without any further inquiry about scientific and ethical aspects of this testing.

Medical Practitioner as Top of Medical Professions

Medical doctor=Bringing these specialists together

Article 17 of Medical Practitioners Law: "Those who are not medical practitioners must not practice medicine ="monopoly of the medical profession"

Article 18 of Medical Practitioners Law: "Those who are not medical practitioners must not use the designation of medical practitioner or its misleading expression="monopoly of the designation"

Other medical professions take partial charge of the medical practitioner.
